It is awesome to work with these kids alongside such a lov-


ing and supportive congregation dedicated to programs such as VBS that lead our kids to know more of God. I am deeply grateful for your support.

Adult Confirmation Is Coming! By: Dr. Gregory S. Neal

In whom do we believe? What do we believe? Why do we believe what we believe? What is the purpose and meaning of the Christian life? What do our beliefs as Christians call us to do in a world that is starving for the Good News of Jesus Christ? These are all good questions, and ones which are addressed in Christian Confirmation classes as young people are prepared



In 2015-2016 I had a fantastic time working with Craig Jensen as we lead a wonderful group of young people through a heart, soul, and mind transforming Confirmation experience. We studied the breadth and depth of our faith, dealing with concepts and ideas that have been common among all Christians since the earliest days of the church as well as with those that are particular to our Protestant and Methodist contexts. We looked at the early development of the church, its history across the centuries, its development, growth as it moved into modern times, and some of the major theological concepts that have lead us to where we are today. We examined the place of Methodism within the broad family of Christian churches and we examined some of the details of organization and structure that govern the life of our denomination. In all of this, we tried to remain open to differences in thought and opinion while striving to reach for a common affirmation of faith in the One who made us and makes us still.

In 2016-2017 we are going to offer a similar experience to the congregation as a whole. While congregational-wide Confirmation can be very challenging, it is also very do-able. It will take patience and a willingness to prepare ahead of time, it will take being open to God's love and grace, and it will take everyone being open to different ideas and even familiar ideas heard in different ways. The plan is that, one Sunday a month (from September 2016 through May 2017) we will meet as congregation-wide class during the Sunday School hour to participate in confirmation. During the month prior to each session we will have time to read through the lesson for the session and be familiar with the basic information in it; when we come together we will talk a few specific concepts from the lessons to look at, we'll ask questions, and we'll share ideas, thoughts and experiences about the study.

Sample copies of the confirmation books will be available for everyone to look at soon, and they will be available to take, read, and use a couple of weeks prior to our first session together. Dates for the study are being set as: Sept 25, October 23, November 13, December 11, January 22, February 26, March 26, April 30, May 21 (the final few dates are tentative and open to adjustment).

I am really looking forward to taking this journey with you! If you have questions, please feel free to ask, and you will be hearing much more about this in the days and weeks to come.

U.M. ARMY Here and There

There is indeed a lot of work in this world for love to do. In the last couple of weeks, FUMC-Commerce has lavished its love on our youth going to Vernon with U.M. ARMY and U.M. ARMY youth camping in our church and working throughout our community. Thanks to your generous gifts of time (cooking, baking, transporting ice, serving, cleaning) and financial support, our youth had extra snacks and the incoming youth had a plenty of food and logistical support while staying with us.



In addition, your generosity helped defray the expenses of some of the projects that exceeded the U.M. ARMY budget.

Gifts totaling \$973.33 came in designated to either help feed U.M. ARMY campers or support the camp where help was needed most. \$638.82 was used to host the welcome taco dinner, purchase chicken, snacks & drinks, and send them off Saturday morning with donuts and pigs in a blanket. The balance of \$334.51 was added to \$1,000 of Serve funds and given to the U.M. ARMY NxNW Chapter to help cover material costs such as a new door, a shower, a toilet, flooring, a window unit, lumber, and loads of siding.

Your love continues to do work. Financial support for VBS – July 18, 19, and 20 – was a great help. The Connect and Serve Teams thank you for all the ways your love does the work in this world – not just here but beyond the city limits as well.

First United Methodist Church Foundation Annual Report 2015


