

Our Ministry With Children

We should all be concerned with the health, education, and faith-formation of children. Throughout his ministry Jesus demonstrated to us that Children have a special place in the Kingdom of God: they are to be loved, protected, and nurtured in the faith while being encouraged to ask questions and enter into their own relationship with God. This was Jesus' own experience as he matured, and one which he clearly cherished for all children:



Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of heaven belongs." (Matthew 19:14; see also Mark 10:14, and Luke 18:16)

Often identified as being the church's future, in reality children are also the church's present. All of our ministries with and for children must be oriented around what is best for them: for their well-being and faith-development. The *Book of Discipline* and the *Book of Resolutions* of The United Methodist Church both outline clear standards for our children's ministries, and FUMCC is paying close attention to these as we chart our course into the future.

John Wesley, the founder of Methodism, gave children's ministries a high priority. Wesley established health clinics and schools for children to encourage their growth in faith, knowledge, and health, as well as in safety and in a life free from the burden of poverty and the toil of child labor. Wesley also required his pastors to care for and teach children on a regular basis. I am pleased to say that First Commerce has an amazing ministry in this area: we have a children's and youth ministry program that engages in powerful mission and ministry in our midst. From VBS to Confirmation to Summer Camps to Reading Programs to the youth UM-ARMY mission trips, and much more, this congregation is reaching out and making a difference in the lives of the young people in our community.

This is also true of Little Ark Nursery and Pre-Kindergarten. We are sometimes asked: "Is Little Ark a mission or ministry of our church?" The short answer to this question is "yes!" Little Ark is not an outside organization that we host in our facilities; it is a critical component of our amazing ministry for children through which we are in mission to little ones and their families. Its purpose is not so much to grow the church as it is to make the spiritual, physical, and intellectual lives of children better. Yes, as the church we can do a better job of reaching out through Little Ark to the families it serves, but even if not a single person joins the church from these efforts they are still an incredible mission of our church to a segment of our population that needs to hear and experience the truth of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. For my own small part, in addition to serving on the Little Ark Board, I have had the pleasure of leading morning chapel with the children and have also met many of the parents of those involved in the program. If you would like to support and be involved in this ministry, I'm sure there is a place for you.

We often forget that the Kingdom of Heaven comes to those who are willing to receive it as a little child: vulnerable and trusting while being willing to change and grow (Matthew 18:3). Children, therefore, play a critical role in the life of the church. We must learn from them how to be true disciples of Jesus Christ; we must un-learn the dysfunctional systems taught to us by our society so that we can learn and grow as children do: openly, willingly, and with much enthusiasm. Working in ministry with and to children can help us to rediscover this incredible truth. Remember, ultimately we are all Children of God.


Bridgeport Camp







FUMC Foundation Announces New Funds

The FUMC Foundation has created two new funds: the Bob Mills HVAC Matching Fund and the Gene Lockhart and John Burkett Music Enrichment Matching Fund.



The Bob Mills HVAC Matching Fund is to complement the fund started in 2014 to honor Bob Mills' service to the church and especially his dedication of time and expertise to the HVAC systems of the sanctuary, the Family Life Center and associated buildings. Taking the lead from past Foundation Boards who wisely set aside funds which financed the sanctuary HVAC system, the current Board made a decision to match the donations already received in Bob's memory with the goal of planning for a future large HVAC expenditure. Going forward, the Foundation will match all donations to the new Bob Mills HVAC Matching Fund up to a total matching amount by the Foundation of \$40,000.00. Any donation, large or small, will help achieve the goal of preparing for the future.

The new Gene Lockhart and John Burkett Music Enrichment Matching Fund is named for two individuals who have each given over 40 years to the music program. The Foundation has started this fund with \$5,000, the amount the Foundation asks for starting a fund for a specific purpose. The Foundation will welcome donations of any size and will match all donations up to a total of \$30,000 by the Foundation. The funds will be used to enrich the music experience at our services and to continue the tradition of musical excellence.

Donation checks should be made to "FUMC Commerce" with a memo "Bob Mills HVAC Matching Fund" or "Lockhart/Burkett Music Enrichment Matching Fund". The donations will be transferred to the Foundation, where the funds will be invested with the Texas Methodist Foundation.
