This all-you-can-eat pancake supper is brought to you by the Connect and Serve Teams. A love offering will be collected to defray cost of meal and to benefit missions.





Times of Prayer

Prayer is one of the fundamental means of grace. It is a glorious gift of God's love, for in and through it each and every one of us can come before the throne of grace and enter into a personal, meaningful, life-transforming relationship with the Almighty Creator of the entire Universe. So frequently we treat prayer as if it were some strange, unnatural, foreign practice of super-spiritual piety; in truth, it is the most natural, human, simplest, and least distant means of grace.



In and through prayer — both individual and communal — we are brought into a closer abiding relationship with God. Prayer isn't just our talking to God, it is also our listening to the voice of God in our lives. We can hear God's voice in many different ways: through the words of Scripture, directly and internally, through the words of great Christian authors and poets, through the words of our family, friends, and loved ones; there are many ways of hearing the voice of God. Prayer is about opening oneself to that voice and allowing God to speak to us, wherever we are and whatever our needs may be.

Sometimes we get so super-spiritual about prayer that we miss the radical reality of its important presence in our lives. We are called to pray everywhere and all the time ... not just at Church and not just in private. Indeed, our very lives are called to be a "prayer unto God." I particularly love the words of Paul concerning prayer:

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. (Philippians 4:4-7 NRSV)

In our prayer life we are called to "rejoice in the Lord always." Even though we live in a difficult world, and even though our lives are very full and very difficult, if we will only open ourselves to God in prayer we can know the true peace of the Presence of Jesus Christ in our lives. That is how we, as a people of faith, can over come such horrible tragedies as the shooting deaths of children in High Schools, or the deaths of family, friends, and loved ones in natural disasters like tornadoes. Left to our own strength, or own abilities, our own sources, we will surely fail to persevere in the tragedies of this life. But with the strength and the power and the love of Almighty God, working in and through us through the many wonderful means of God's grace, we can be assured of the strength and the peace to make it through our trial and tribulations. Note what Paul says: "do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God." Bad things will happen ... they always have, and in this life they always will. But through prayer, through abiding with the Love of God in Jesus Christ, we can be assured that we will have the Peace of God, which passes all of our human ways of understanding.

In 2018 we are beginning a new prayer initiative. Every evening, before you go to bed, I invite you to take the prayer list you will find elsewhere in this Newsletter and to pray through the names you will find there. I invite you to do the same with the weekly list you'll find in your worship bulletin. I also invite you to take the photo directory and to pray for the names and faces you will find there. And, if you know of people that we need to be praying for, please let the church office know. As we move forward, we will have many opportunities to gather for prayer and to pray for our church and for your friends and families by name. Our first opportunity to do this will be Wednesday, January 31, at 6pm in chapel. You are invited to come and join with me for a half-hour of focused prayer, together, for our church.

PROYECTO ABRIGO MISSION TRIP 2018 Amazing Grace: Want Some? Get Some!

What amazing grace it is to follow the words of Jesus: "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me." (Matt. 25:40)

Spring Break, smack in the middle of Lent, can make it hard to stick to all those spiritual commitments you'll be making on Ash Wednesday, but have I got a deal for you! The mission trip to Juárez falls exactly during that time (March 11-March 16) making it much easier to honor your spiritual diet of prayer and reaching out to help others in need. Dire need. Please prayerfully consider joining the team. You'll come back renewed, spiritually refreshed, and overflowing with Amazing Grace. Guaranteed.

The families we serve live in abysmally inadequate "shelters" made from trash bags, cardboard, the occasional scrap piece of particle board or lumber. Such are the conditions for many families who have traveled north to Juárez in search of work and a better life. They have no running water, no electricity, no heat, no air conditioning. Food is scarce, but their faith is unbounded. Amazing Grace.

Rev. José Luis Portillo began his ministry of building shelters for these truly indigent families nearly 20 years ago because a 2 year-old child froze to death in his family's squalid trash bag and cardboard housing. José Luis appealed to many churches in the US to come to his aid by sending teams to build houses made of cinder blocks and mortar for those who lived in similar conditions. Commerce FUMC has answered that call on many occasions, but it's been four years and the need is still dire.

If you can't go but still would love to help, you can! You can fully sponsor a team member for \$150 to pay room and board, sponsor a team member's passport expenses for \$150, or sponsor a couple of cinder blocks (or however many you'd like) for \$20 each. Vitamins, over-the-counter medicines, and medical supplies are always needed. The children enjoy soccer balls, coloring books, and crayons. Pick up a few next time you're wherever you shop and drop them off at the church. There will be a basket below the bulletin board in the hall next to the office for that purpose. Any donation you can make is greatly appreciated. That's Amazing Grace, too!

Many, many thanks for all the prescription bottles and medical supplies that have been donated over the years. They have been sent to the mission for use in the clinic which serves approximately 200+ patients per week. Blessings on you, FUMC-Commerce. You have faithfully served the people of Juárez, but the need is still great. Participate in any way you can. Amazing Grace.
