

We have all watched with horror as the events have unfolded in Haiti. Whole buildings flattened, debris and dust, and bodies... the bodies. It's gruesome and gut wrenching and so terribly, terribly sad.

And then we got the news we had lost one of our extended family, Rev. Clinton Rabb, Robert's brother and Mary Beth Tuck's nephew. A United Methodist pastor and head of the Volunteers in Mission (VIM) program for the whole United Methodist Church, the loss is



Clint was what we call, "One of the Good Guys!" He worked for what can arguably be one of the most bureaucratic, red-tape-filled organizations in the world: the general church. The General Board of Global Ministries oversees the work of every mission on the globe—no small task. And incredible life-changing ministries are accomplished.

Lives are transformed because of people like Clinton Rabb. He was not one to sit behind his desk. He was always on the ground seeing what the needs were and then making connections to make a difference.

When he realized that the war-ravaged, volatile nation of Colombia was in dire need for basics like water as well has deep spiritual healing AND that they had been largely overlooked by outsiders because of the fear of lingering violence, Clint gathered a team to go. Robert Rabb and Dana Coker were on that first team. Thanks to Clinton's initiative, and Robert & Tina's ongoing commitment to be the VIM coordinators for Colombia, there are now teams working to improve the conditions in that desperate place.

Clinton was in Haiti with several others looking at ways to strengthen the medical missions that do so much good in that struggling country.

In the face of such loss, I can't help but wonder what possible good can come out of this devastation. God promises streams in the desert, a way out of no way. Paul reminds us that "all things come together for good," so I'm looking for the good. I'm not sure I can

Don't get me wrong, I see God everywhere... in the people coming together to help, in the singing of praises right there in the midst of the rubble, in rescue workers and people all over the world donating time and money... I see the presence of God.

So, then I think maybe it seems like there's very little good to be gained from this horrific tragedy, but I know one "Good Guy" who would be praying that more attention be given to the dire situation in Haiti—not just the earthquake recovery, but every day conditions. Perhaps, if nothing else, we as a world might be reminded that we are indeed our neighbor's keeper.

"Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another." 1 John 4:11 By the grace of God, may it be so!

Sisters Too Bible Study starts up Monday, January 25 at Jane Langford's home (2014 Creekview Drive) at 12:00pm.


