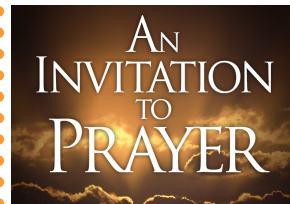

The Sayings of Jesus from the Cross by Dr. Gregory S. Neal

During the Season of Lent we will be looking at what is known in Christian tradition as “The Seven Last Words from the Cross.” These are actually phrases, sentences, prayers, and scripture citations that Jesus uttered while he was dying upon the cross and which were recorded in at least one of the four canonical Gospels. Three of them appear only in the Gospel of Luke, three appear only in the Gospel of John, and one appears only in the Gospels of Mark and Matthew. They are:




- “Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing” (Luke 23:34)
- “Today you will be with me in paradise” (Luke 23:43)
- “Behold your son: behold your mother” (John 19:26-27)
- “My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?” (Matthew 27:46 and Mark 15:34)
- “I Thirst” (John 19:28)
- “It is finished” (John 19:30)
- “Father, into your hands I commend my spirit.” (Luke 23:46)

Our Sunday messages during Lent will focus upon these last sayings of Jesus in order to see what we can discern about our Lord’s self-understanding and experience. In the process it is my prayer that we will also discover a little bit about ourselves: about our relationship with God and with each other.

By the time you read this we will have already examined two of these saying: “Father, forgive them, for they don’t know what they are doing” and “Today you will be with me in paradise.” Regarding the first of these sayings, we learned that Jesus prayed for those who were killing him, *as they were killing him*, that they would be forgiven. This prayer for forgiveness extends even to us, for we put Jesus to death through our own sins just as assuredly as the Romans drove the nails into his flesh or the Sanhedrin sentenced him to death. It is through this prayer of our Lord that we can find, exemplified, God’s grace and the power of the cross to redeem: the one who sacrificed himself for us offered this prayer even amidst his own suffering, thinking not of himself but of others. Truly, that is amazing grace!

In the second saying, we learned that Jesus’ promise to the thief on the cross is one that we also must hear: when Jesus says “today you will be with me in paradise” we are reminded that salvation isn’t a prize that we attain in the future but, rather, a way life for *today* which sees us even through death and into eternity. We, like the thief on the cross, simply have to recognize who Jesus is and ask him: “Remember me, when you come into your kingdom.” This is also a logical progression from the word of forgiveness: we go from Jesus praying for us to be forgiven to Jesus promising us that he will be with us. Even when the circumstances are difficult, the pain is real, and the future appears bleak, Jesus assures us that we will not go through our “dark night of the soul” alone: God is right here, suffering with us, and so we have nothing to fear for paradise is ours.

Come to worship and join us in our Lenten journey through these seven last words from the cross. We would love to see you there.

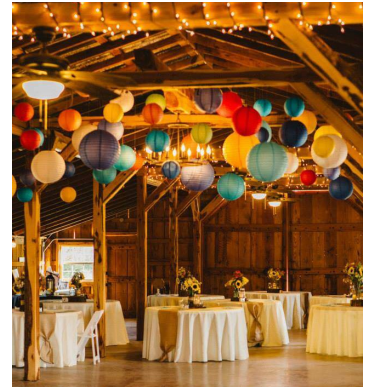

What is U.M. ARMY?

U. M. ARMY stands for United Methodist Action Reach-Out Mission by Youth. U. M. ARMY began in 1979 with a youth mission trip to Athens, Texas, where youth groups from several Houston churches gathered to provide home repair assistance to people in need.



Today this organization has grown to more than 30 separate missions throughout East and Southeast Texas with over 3,500 youth and adult volunteers annually. The mission is two-fold: serving people in need, and providing young people an opportunity to mature in their faith-walk and life skills through Christian service.

The mission is accomplished every summer when thousands of youth and adult volunteers sacrifice a week of their vacation to join God's ARMY. Using a local Methodist church as a base where they gather to have their meals, sleep in classrooms, and worship in the Sanctuary, participants spend each day of the week providing free home repairs for low-income, elderly, and disabled homeowners in the surrounding area.

Our church will be the host to a group of God's ARMY this summer, July 22-28, 2018. And our community will benefit from their service projects. Please mark your calendars, as there will be many ways to support the campers while they are here.

U.M. ARMY (continued)

U.M. ARMY is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization. Participant fees and individual donations provide a large part of the budget for mission operational costs and administrative overhead. Individual donations and in-kind donations of building materials and food are another important source of funding that helps keep participant fees as low as possible.

U.M. ARMY is the mission for our Lenten Offering this year. All designated gifts and \$1 bills will be donated to U.M. ARMY. Donations will be used to provide meals and supplement supply costs this summer. Any remaining donations will go to our area chapter.
