

Faithfulness

In the past six weeks, we have been teaching and preaching the Fruit of the Spirit. Let us not think the evidences of the Fruit of the Spirit in us are things we can just muster up by our own will. Being full of faith is more of a gift than an act of will. For a time maybe we can act our way into that, moving toward faith; but we cannot endure or last into it. Some might say "Fake it 'til you make it." I don't know... That saying is for casual musicians more than sincere followers of Jesus who welcome the fruitful gifts of the Holy Spirit.

"Improvisation" is a respectable talent in music. But there are still skills to acquire, some rules to follow-- even in what most musicians know as "Improv". A good player can become a great player by improving at improvising. But there are rules and structures to follow.



I remember a preacher (my father) saying, "Preach faith until you have it!" Faith is an odd mix of putting what you have out there, and waiting for God to bless it and grow it. We have to do our part to cultivate, to run with patience the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus for our strength (Hebrews 12:1-2). And we remember that when that faith we have worked for eventually seems solid, no matter how hard we have worked, that faith is still a gift.

Don't give up when you don't feel it. We celebrate faith that comes as a gift and becomes a dialogue between you/me and God. Faithfulness is being filled with seeds that are a gift of the Holy Spirit! And cultivating their growth. We start small and grow it through the "step-ups" and "set-backs" and all the tempo changes of the seasons of life.

Imagine faith as a grain of mustard seed who fully expects to grow into a plant large enough for nesting birds. Get the chord changes down, a bass line, a layer of faith led by the Spirit. Then float your melody on top of that and improvise!

Join us in Children's Sunday School as we begin our spring curriculum. This month's Bible verse is "Now is the time! Here comes God's kingdom! Change your hearts and lives, and trust this good news! (Mark 1:15)

On March 3, we will read Luke 15:3-10. We will learn two "stories of the lost". We will talk about how we feel when we lose things, how we feel when we find them and discuss why we think Jesus shared these stories with the Pharisees.

On March 10, we will read Luke 15:11-32 (The Forgiving Father). We will talk a lot about forgiveness, share our own experiences and discuss Jesus' reason for sharing this story.

On March 17, we will read Luke 7:36-47 (The Two Debtors). We will continue talking about forgiveness and think about people that may need grace. We will share our own experiences of showing and needing grace and forgiveness.

This year's Lenten Offering will be used to support **community health** with the designated agencies being Carevide and Raffa.

Carevide is a nonprofit healthcare provider. It has several different programs including school-ERING based clinics in which Commerce ISD is now participating. The school district will furnish the physical facility and Carevide will provide the staff, including a physi-

cian's assistant or nurse practitioner, and all equipment.
 How does a school-based clinic work? Communication is paramount. Before any action can be taken by the school or clinic, parents will be informed and a verbal consent obtained. □ Parents will complete a written consent form so that their student/students can participate □ When a student goes to the school nurse and the nurse determines that he/she needs to go to the school-based clinic, the nurse communicates to the parents and the school transports the student to the clinic. □ Based on the examination by the PA or NP, the student might be sent back to school, receive treatment at the clinic or be referred to another facility for testing or treatment. □ If the student may return to school, the school would provide transportation, however if the student needs to go home or to another facility the parent is responsible for transporting the student. □ Carevide will bill Medicaid or private insurance companies. If the family has no insurance, they will be charged on a sliding scale; however Carevide never turns accounts over to a collection agency.
 How will the Commerce school-based clinic operate? □ A facility behind the middle school is currently under renovation. □ Initially the clinic would be open two days a week, □ The plan is to have the renovation complete by the fall of 2019-2020 school year.
Your Lenten Offering will help underwrite the renovation so it is completed in a timely fashion. Kathy Myers, director of CISD Health Services, will be our guest one Sunday during Lent. Watch for details.
Raffa Clinic is a non-profit pregnancy clinic committed to providing women and men accurate information to make informed decisions about pregnancy and sexual health. All services are free of charge! Raffa clinic services include: Free pregnancy testing and ultrasounds Pregnancy options counseling Group parenting classes and one-on-one mentoring
The daily costs of operation for the Raffa Clinic is \$804. This includes all medical services, supplies, bills, and staff costs. In addition to monetary donations, Raffa Clinic is ALWAYS in need of diapers for fami-

lies, especially sizes 4,5&6.

In 2018, Raffa Clinic had 1,986 client visits, serving clients from 20 different counties. Raffa Clinic is located in Greenville at 2612 Jordan Street.

Raffa director, Threesa Sadler will be our guest on Sunday, March 31 for our 10:50am service to share more about Raffa Clinic during a Mission Moment.
