

Children's Chapel

As I wrote in last month's newsletter, Little Ark is a vital mission and ministry of our congregation through which we are reaching children and their families with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. In their lessons, crafts, playtime, and in how they treat the children and their parents, the teachers and administration at Little Ark are building a strong foundation of faith in, and love for, God. I've been very impressed with the lesson-plans, the structure of the program, and the character and dedication of those involved in Little Ark. And, it has been my privilege to participate in a small way.



I have been enjoying weekly chapel time with the kids. About 20 children come into the chapel, along with their teachers, and they settle on the floor in front of me while I sit on the step-up into the chancel. I usually begin our time together by leading them in singing "Jesus Loves Me" and "Jesus Loves the Little Children," both being my personal favorites from my own days in pre-school and kindergarten. I will sometimes also teach them another song, like "This Little Light of Mine" or "Zacchaeus," especially if the song goes along with what we're doing that day. I then tell them a Bible story, using one of several picture-book Bibles to help illustrate the stories. I explain why something in the story happened and how we can know that God loves us. The most important thing that I want the children to learn and come to accept for themselves is that God loves them just the way they are, that God made them to be who and what they are, and that *nothing* they might do will ever cause God to stop loving them. Then, I lead them in a prayer, which they follow, and we close the chapel time with the singing of one of the songs that we sang at the beginning. They then go out and play. It's a very simple yet meaningful time with the children and I pray that they are learning something in the experience. At the most recent Little Ark graduation (in late April 2017) some parents thanked me for the story-telling I've been doing with their kids; one mother said that she enjoyed hearing her child re-tell the story the way I did, and that the songs were also special to them.

As we move into the Fall here at FUMCC we have many opportunities for mission and ministry with the families and children of our community. In a time when the world is shaken by wars and rumors of wars, by hatred and bigotry and racism, we must be about speaking the truth of the Love of God in Jesus Christ our Lord to all. Be it with Little Ark, the local Elementary, Middle, or Senior High Schools, we must be in ministry with and to young people. Our Children's and Youth ministries must continue to be a principle priority of this Church, and I thank God for all those who are working hard in these areas.

(Psalm 139:14)





Mission of the Month

We are recognizing Hunger Action Month by making the North Texas Food Bank (NTFB) our September mission of the month. All \$1 bills and designated gifts to missions during September will benefit the NTFB. Financial support is needed now more than ever to meet the

food assistance needs of Hurricane Harvey disaster victims as well as the increased need for food at partner agencies.

Feeding America established Hunger Action Month in 2008 as a nationwide effort to get people involved with the hunger crisis across the county. Advocates work together to shine a light on this pressing issue, affecting 17,260 of our neighbors right here in Hunt County. Feeding America is the nation's largest domestic hunger relief organization, and the North Texas Food Bank is a member of it.

As a member of Feeding America, the NTFB distributes donated and purchased foods to more than 200 partner agencies in 13 counties. Three of those partner agencies serve our food-insecure neighbors in the Commerce area:

- Bread of Life Food Pantry located at Church of the Nazarene in Commerce
- Commerce Food Pantry located at First Presbyterian Church of Commerce
- Hunt County Shared Ministries FISH in downtown Greenville

- ✓ Place your \$1 bills and designated gifts in the offering plate throughout September, which will go directly to the NTFB.
- ✓ "Meat the Need" by bringing in canned protein such as Spam for the Commerce Food Pantry. Please place your donations in the collection box outside the church office during September.
- ✓ Drop your handled brown bags like the ones from Braum's by the church office. Food 4 Kids and the Commerce Food Pantry will reuse them.
- ✓ Volunteer at Bread of Life Food Pantry on Sunday, September 17, from 1 to 3 p.m. We will help pantry manager Becky Glass prepare boxes for the pantry's upcoming distribution.
